I believe the time has come for us to once again hear the words of a great and highly respected American president who brought us through a horrible financial situation, a World War, and the fear that stood to paralyze us as a nation. This is an excerpt from the First Inagural Address of Franklin Delano Roosevelt on March 4, 1933:

"I am certain that my fellow Americans expect that on my induction into the Presidency, I will address them with a candor and a decision which the present situation of our people impel. This is preeminently the time to speak the truth, the whole truth, frankly and boldly. Nor need we shrink from honestly facing conditions in our country today. This great Nation will endure as it has endured, will revive and will prosper. So, first of all, let me assert my firm belief that the only thing we have to fear is fear itself—nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror which paralyzes needed efforts to convert retreat into advance."

Roosevelt understood what greed had done to our country. The situation created by greed created the roaring twenties, the easy credit investing, and the financial collapse. In many ways, we are in the same place today. Fear of disease and of a financial collapse are driving decisions – important decisions – that will affect the future. Roosevelt is not the only voice we need to hear. Actually, it is not the most important one in my opinion. The most important voice is that of the

Psalmist. Psalm 27 (believed to be one of David's Psalms) asks us two very important questions in the first

verse: "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?" (Psalm 27:1 NRSV) David surely understood fear

and terror of King Saul who desired to kill him and later his one son, Absalom, who also wanted to see him dead. We can almost hear David's steadfast assurance that God is in control and is able to preserve him. "When evildoers assail me to devour my flesh—my adversaries and foes-they shall stumble and fall." (27:2 NRSV) We see in other situations that believers in the old and new testament put the same faith in God and God's ability to make good out of the bad. Please notice I didn't say to make the bad good but for us to find blessing and growth even in the midst of the problems of life. Shadrach, Meshach, and the Abednego. facing death at hands Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, still refused to bow down to his statue. When asked if they thought God would save them, their reply was we don't know if he will, but we know He can and regardless we will serve Him. (My paraphrase). They did not let fear stand in the way of their faith in God just as David did not. Today we are faced with possibly the biggest fear of a generation, the fear of a horrible disease and a financial crisis. So, how do we proceed?

We pray, we trust God, we do the things we need to do to survive physically. We trust God is able to give us the wisdom to rebuild the economy here and around the world – we trust God is able. I know we are frightened and confused, but God always works on the side of human life over money and wealth. He calls us to trust in Him not in horses or chariots, the Rolls and Bentley's of the day. Psalm 20:7-8 (NIV) "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God. They are brought to their knees and fall, but we rise up and stand firm."

This day I am choosing to place my life and my trust in the ability of God to continue to create a new world in our presence as we grow in His grace, wisdom, and LOVE. Let us choose who we will follow: the fear






