### Celebrate Recovery

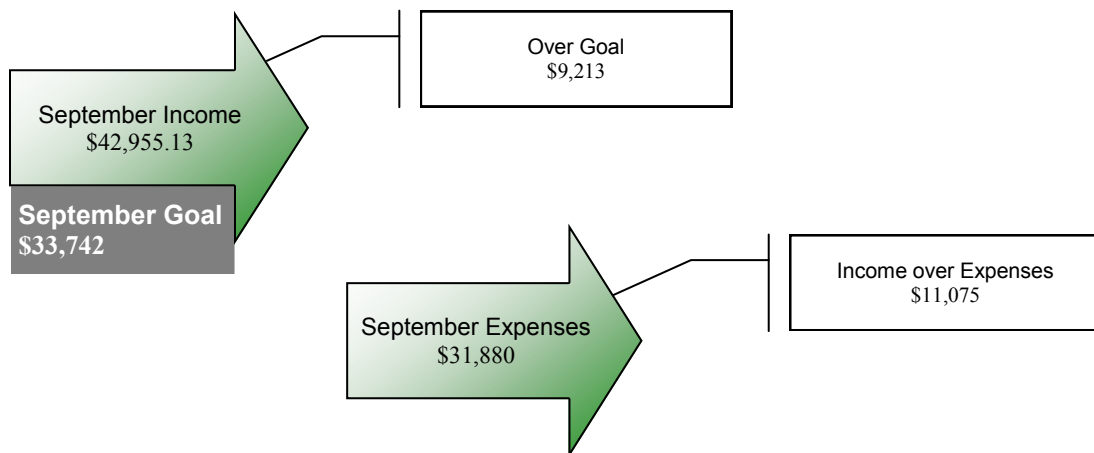

## YOUR Administrative Council

(Entry Two)

I'm back! So sorry that I was absent for the October "Messenger", but it's a little hard to type on a laptop when you have no power...Hurricane Irma left our home without power and water for 5 days, those basic necessities that we all take for granted, daily. Very humbling, somewhat inconvenient, but we all should also remember that we are very blessed to all be safe, that GOD was and always will be our refuge in times of trouble, that He is our protector (Psalms 91).

In this edition, I'd like to share with you the purpose of a Church Council and what its ongoing mission and ministry is to our church. This comes from The United Methodist Church "Book of Discipline":

**PURPOSE:** The church councils shall provide for planning and implementing a program of nurture, outreach, witness, and resources in the local church. It shall also provide for the administration of its organization and temporal life. It shall envision, plan, implement, and annually evaluate the mission and ministry of the church. The church council shall be amenable to and function as the administrative agency of the charge conference.

**MISSION AND MINISTRY:** Nurture, outreach, and witness ministries and their accompanying responsibilities include:

The nurturing ministries of the congregation shall give attention to but not limited to education, worship, Christian formation, membership care, small groups, and stewardship. Attention must be given to the needs of individuals and families of all ages.

The outreach ministries of the church shall give attention to local and larger community ministries of compassion, justice, and advocacy. These ministries include church and society, global ministries, higher education and campus ministry, health and welfare, Christian unity, interreligious concerns, religion and race, and the status and role of women.

The witness ministries of the church shall give attention to developing and strengthening evangelistic efforts of sharing of personal and congregational stories of Christian experience, faith and service; communications; Lay Servant Ministries; and other means that give expressions of witness for Jesus Christ.

The leadership development and resourcing ministries shall give attention to the ongoing preparation and development of lay and clergy leaders for the ministry of the church.

The nurture, outreach, and witness ministries and their accompanying responsibilities shall include:

1. Consideration of the election of a prayer coordinator to promote prayer and mobilize the local church to pray.
2. Establishing a prayer room or designated place for prayer and prayer resources.
3. Encouraging intentional prayer for the pastoral leadership of the local church.

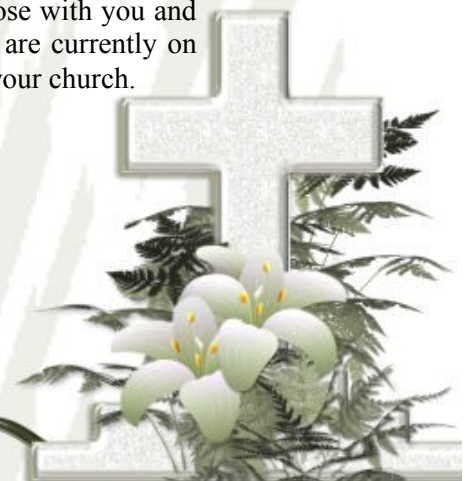

## Report from FUMC Trustees

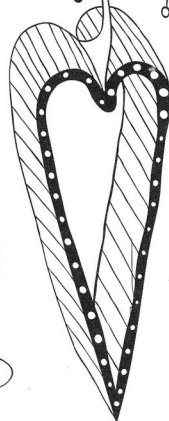
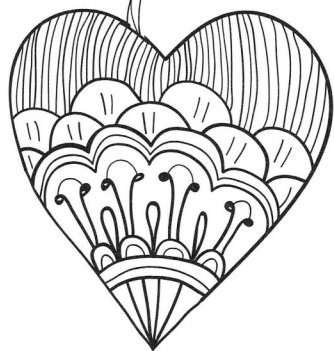
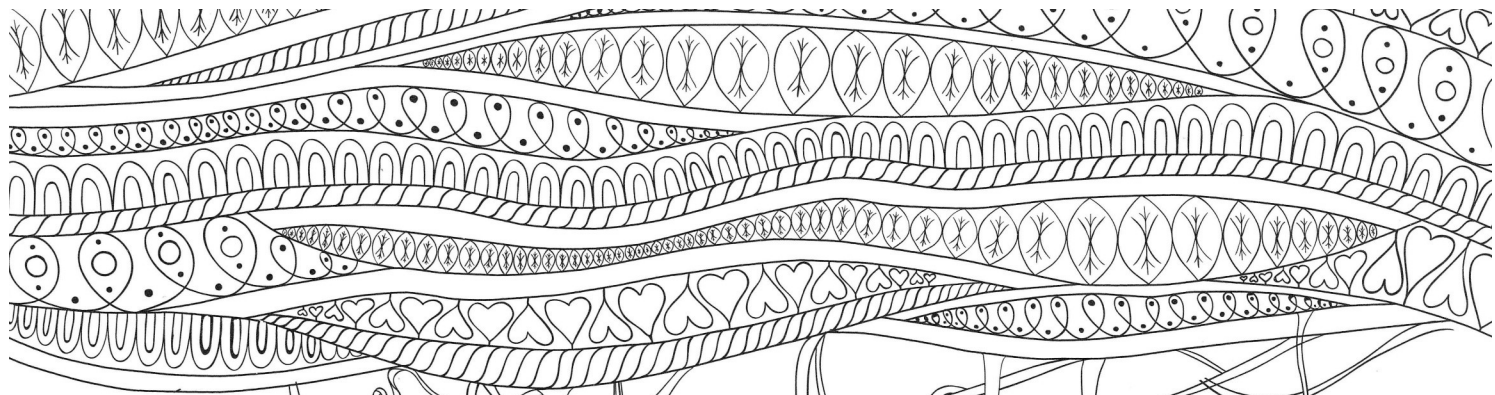
The primary responsibility of Trustees is to oversee, maintain, and supervise all local church property. The purpose of this update is to inform our congregation about funds related to the lease agreement with Legacy Academy Charter School. As you all know, Trustees and other church members worked over the summer to clean out areas included in the lease agreement. Thank you to everyone for your efforts. The Trustees passed a motion on June 19<sup>th</sup> that all funds from the lease with Legacy Academy be placed in the Repair and Maintenance Fund, not the General Fund. Our lease agreement began July 1, 2017. Since that time, repairs have been made to the roof of the Education Building and above Trinity classroom due to leaks, and installment of air conditioning units above Cruisers and the Choir room. The Sanctuary roof replacement is scheduled to begin during November. Additional projects include repair and/or replacement of roofing for other buildings on church property and parsonage, as well as necessary repairs and upgrades needed for building maintenance. Your Trustees have made a prayerful decision that has helped a new school in need of a temporary location. This in turn has provided funds for necessary repairs and upgrades needed for our church property.

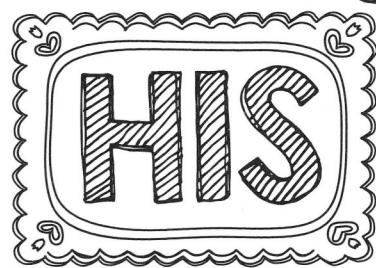

## News From The Atlantic Central District and The Florida Conference

To the People of the Florida Annual Conference:

Each of you has been in my prayers as we have journeyed through Hurricane Irma. Traveling around our state, I have seen with my own eyes the courage of our pastors and the vulnerability of many of our impoverished communities who were hit hard by this storm. Thank you for what you have already done and for your willingness to continue to be a part of the short-term relief and long-term recovery efforts. God will use these efforts to further extend our witness into our communities.

We encourage churches to continue to give to UMCOR. 100% of donations go to relief work. We do know there will be needs beyond those for which UMCOR can care. To that end, the Cabinet has established the Hurricane Irma Fund which will help to repair local churches in the Florida Conference and rebuild the communities that surround them in the spirit of Isaiah 65. ### A Journey with Christ

“While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them.” — Luke 24:15

The Walk to Emmaus (for adults), Face to Face (for those who are 60 +), Journey (for young adults), and Chrysalis (for High School Sophomores-Seniors who are 16-19), weekends are experiences of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a short three-day course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God’s grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus, Journey, and Chrysalis weekend experiences begin with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and, in God’s time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. (Please talk with Richard & Grace Barron and/or Fred & Kaye Ball for sponsorship.)

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ.

Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant’s individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities, and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Face to Face is an experience in the Emmaus tradition for persons 60 and older. This event takes place in our local church and allows participants to “go home at night” as well as might meet once a week for 8 weeks.

## OKTOBERFEST

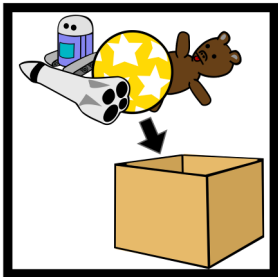


