Major initiatives fact sheet: fresh expressions

Aromas of stew, chicken, and yellow rice and chili. Sounds of hammers, saws, stacking lumber, and laughter while renovating a bath house. Sights of low income, makeshift campers.

This is the church.

It doesn't look, smell, or sound like yours.

It began when First UMC of Starke realized the residents of a trailer park community weren't going to come to their church; the church was going to have to go to them. They began a Crockpot Ministry, feeding the residents every Tuesday evening, and the ministry grew as an inspiring example of a "Fresh Expression" church. First Starke moved through a process of *listening* to what the community's needs are to *loving and serving* them to *building up and with* the community to *forming disciples* and worship.

Listening, loving, and serving, building and worship: this is the metamorphosis of forming a new kind of church. Fresh Expressions is an international movement that has us reaching new people in their backyards and moving beyond our conventional building, meetings, and leaders. It has the mindset of "we'll come to you." The aim is to form a new gathering or network—church—that engages mainly with people who have never been to church and in their own context and culture. At its best, Fresh Expressions is led by laity and clergy and works alongside more traditional churches like First Starke.

Fresh Expressions Florida began a year ago. Like the movement, its growth has been grassroots based. It started with a working group of 20 people to form a Florida vision and mission statement: *Fresh Expressions Florida catalyzes new expressions of church that reach new people, in new places, in new ways.* The working group helped launch our first "pioneer" retreat, which included more than 60 clergy and lay persons who came to learn about Fresh Expressions and discern how they might start one in their own communities. A second retreat was held this past winter, and potential pioneers were able to go deeper into their discerning and calling to start a Fresh Expression. Alongside the retreats for support and inspiration, we have a Facebook group that is a spring board for conversation based on a reading list with books for each liturgical season.

In January 2015, a smaller group was formed to steer the movement towards three key goals. First, strengthening partnerships with Fresh Expressions US, UK, and Duke Divinity School's work in Christian Entrepreneurship. Second, continuing education for clergy and laity in our conference. Third, the support groups, and prayer teams. With much excitement, we will be awarding the first set of grants this June. For more information, contact Rev. A Journey with Christ

“While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them.” - Luke 24:15

Both the Walk to Emmaus (for adults), Face to Face (for those who are 60 +), Journey (for young adults) and Chrysalis (for High School Sophomores-Seniors who are 16-19) weekends are experiences of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a three-day short course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God’s grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus, Journey and Chrysalis weekend experiences begin with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and in God’s time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. (Please talk with Richard & Grace Barron and/or Fred & Kaye Ball for sponsorship.)

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ.

Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant’s individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Face to Face is an experience in the Emmaus tradition for persons 60 and older. This event takes place in our local church and allows participants to “go home at night” as well as possibly meeting once a week for 8 weeks.

UMCOR Responds to Hurricanes Irma & Maria

Monday, September 18: Update on U.S. Disaster Response

Cathy Earl, UMCOR's director of U.S. disaster response, met with conference personnel to review and support The Florida Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church to optimize communication pathways, distribution of supplies, and coordination of volunteers as the conference plans for recovery. Staff have been assigned to manage communications for two weeks. Florida Annual Conference hired a director of recovery ministries and identified a volunteer coordinator. Barbara Tripp, UMCOR disaster response consultant, will follow up with Florida Annual Conference to help establish ERT reception and the volunteer network. Florida Annual Conference has been asked by FEMA to lead the case management task force. UMCOR will also be supporting this work through grants and technical guidance.

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) anticipates granting at least \$500,000 in funds to each of the affected conferences after the assessment phase is complete and unmet needs are identified.

Friday, September 22, 2017

With the passing of the storm, hurricane Maria left Puerto Rico with severe damage to homes, power lines, and widespread flooding. Puerto Rico Gov. Ricardo Rosselló said Maria is the "most devastating storm to hit the island this century, if not in modern history."

Officials from Puerto Rico's power companies say that Puerto Ricans might not get power back for four to six months, however, hospitals and water systems will get priority power restoration. Powered by emergency generators, the island's largest airport, the Luis Muñoz Marín International Airport, was opened to receive military and rescue operations on Thursday.

At this time, UMCOR is unable to receive communications from its partners on the island because of power outages. UMCOR will wait to respond as its partners conduct an assessment of what is most needed.

We encourage churches to continue to give to UMCOR. 100% of donations go to relief work. We do know there will be needs beyond those for which UMCOR can care. To that end, the Cabinet has established the [Hurricane Irma Fund](#), which will help to repair local churches in the Florida Conference and rebuild the communities that surround them in the spirit of Isaiah 65. The funds will be distributed by the Bishop and Cabinet with accountability to the Council on Finance and Administration.

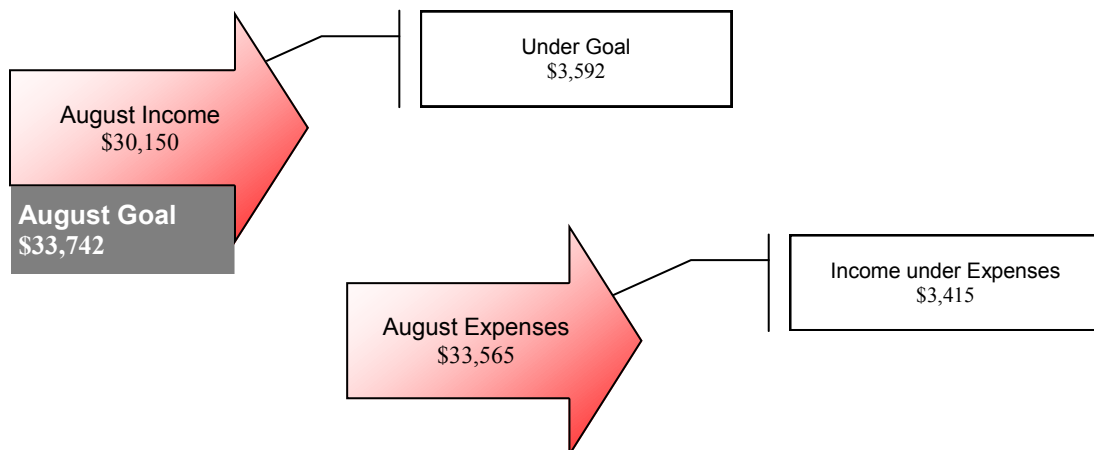
United Methodist Beliefs Class


