

A Journey with Christ

(Reprinted from www.upperroom.org programs)

While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and walked with them. - Luke 24:15

Both the Walk to Emmaus (for adults), Face to Face (for those who are 60 +), Journey (for young adults), Chrysalis (for High School Sophomores-Seniors who are 16-19) and Discovery (for Middle School students) weekends are experiences of Christian spiritual renewal and formation that begins with a three-day short course in Christianity. It is an opportunity to meet Jesus Christ in a new way as God's grace and love is revealed to you through other believers.

The Walk to Emmaus, Journey, and Chrysalis weekend experiences begin with the prayerful discernment and invitation from a sponsor. After one accepts this invitation they complete an application. The Emmaus leaders prayerfully consider each applicant and in God's time, the person is invited to attend a three-day experience of New Testament Christianity as a lifestyle. (Please talk with Richard & Grace Barron and/or Fred & Kaye Ball for sponsorship.)

Following the three-day experience, participants are joined in small groups to support each other in their ongoing walk with Christ.

Through the formational process of accountable discipleship in small groups and participation in the Emmaus community, each participant's individual gifts and servant-leadership skills are developed for use in the local church and its mission. Participants are encouraged to find ways to live out their individual call to discipleship in their home, church, and community.

The objective of Emmaus is to inspire, challenge, and equip the local church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, communities, and places of work. Emmaus lifts up a way for our grace-filled lives to be lived and shared with others.

Face to Face is an experience in the Emmaus tradition for persons 60 and older. This event takes place in our local church and allows participants to "go home at night" as well as might meet once a week for 8 weeks.

In Leesburg: October 5 – 8, 2017 for Men's weekend; October 12 to 15 for the Women's Weekend.

In West Deland: October 21-24, 2017 for Men's weekend; October 12 to 15 for the Women's Weekend.


United Methodist Beliefs Class

Whether you have never heard of The Christian Church: "United Methodist" or you have been a United Methodist all of your life, you are cordially invited to a three week Sunday school class on United Methodist beliefs. This class will begin on Sunday mornings after the morning worship service (about 11:20) and last until noon in The Adult Studies room. It is being taught by Pastor Fred Ball.

The class covers such topics as: sharing your life's story and Christ's story; telling the story about the Christian and First United Methodist Church; what First Church does and how you can participate in our ministries. This class will begin on Sunday, September 3 and finish on Sunday, September 17. If you want to join our church, you'll want to attend these 3 sessions. If you cannot stay after worship services to attend these classes, please contact Pastor Fred and he will be happy to arrange a special class for you during the week (this would be about 90 minutes). Everyone is welcome to attend!

The Church's Budgeted Finances

The Finance Committee appreciates your contributions and donations. With your support we will be able to continue sharing God's love with those around us.



The budget for the year is **\$404,897** which has been divided evenly making each month's goal \$33,742 rather than being weighted differently throughout the year.

United Methodist Women

The ministries of FUMC of Titusville's United Methodist Women are primarily focused on women, children, and youth. We support our local community and the church as well as the international community. Our membership is open to any woman who would like to join us. You do not have to be a member of the church. Come and check us out. We would love to have you join us. We are always looking for new members and new ideas. We meet six (6) times a year on the 2nd Tuesday of August (6 p.m. covered dish), October (10 a.m.), December (6 p.m. Christmas Social), January (10 a.m.), March (10 a.m.), and May (10 a.m.) in the Fellowship Hall.

Our projects include:

- † Salvation Army of Titusville - we provide fresh vegetables and fruits, meat, canned goods, rice or noodles, and spices for their soup kitchen. These are purchased and delivered the last week of every month.
- † STOP Hunger Now – we support our church in this international ministry with funds and volunteers.
- † FUMC Titusville's Christmas Store – we support this community need with funds, donations and volunteers.
- † Santa Cruz Methodist in the Holguin District of Cuba – we support our sister church in whatever way we can. The major ministry is to supply the over the counter drugs for our Cuban church family.
- † Olive Branch Visitation – we purchase the elements for communion that is used by this ministry.
- † Celebration of Life Receptions – we are responsible for the bereavement receptions following a funeral. We have scheduled a coordinator and at least two assistants for each month and we will do the planning, acquiring the food, serving, and clean-up following the reception.
- † Methodist Children's Home – they will always have a place in our hearts and whatever support we can give them will continue.
- † We support the young people of north Brevard thru Hope for North Brevard.
- † We continue our monetary contribution to the Women's Center of North Brevard.
- † We have taken on a new ministry with assistance to National Veterans' Homeless Support group and we are targeting women veterans.
- † We are also working with Rolling Readers to provide funds and readers for elementary school children so that they may become more interested in reading.

Other ministries that have great value to us are: Dove Circle – The Olive Branch Card and Visitation Ministry visits of our homebound church family members where they bring small gifts and serve Holy Communion every other month. Cards are sent in the months that they do not visit. Patchwork Friends – provides hand crafted quilts to our church family, nursing homes, local fire and police departments for traumatized children, military men and women of our church family, loved ones in the hospital and those with special needs.

We are blessed to have Pastor Fred Ball as our minister at FUMC Titusville. He has been supportive of us and complimentary of what we achieved.

Whether you give time, your talents, money, or prayers you help make us a productive group who are helping to do God's work. All the things we have accomplished or are planning to accomplish are done with Jesus. It is with Him that we can make a difference.

Here we make an average of 100 quilts which are distributed to various members of our congregation who are sick, doing rehab, in the hospital, to families with a new baby or who have lost a loved one.



We also give quilts to our service men and women currently serving, to veterans, and to family members entering the service. Our red, white and blue quilts are used to decorate the sanctuary for Memorial Day, Veterans Day, Labor Day, and World Prayer Day.

You do not need to know how to sew to join us. We break down the process into many small jobs. If you can iron, use scissors, tie a knot, or match colors, we can use your help. This is a small group who would welcome new members. Each quilt we make is done so with loving hands and with healing prayers.
